Camping in Rocky Mountain National Park

Hello DMHS families! We are planning a three-day camping trip to Glacier Basin campground in Rocky Mountain National Park. The campground is located in a basin with 360 degree views of the mountains.

The purpose of this trip is to strengthen the DMHS community and build students' adaptability, independence, collaboration, and communication. Students will be sleeping in four-person tents at the campground. There are flush toilets and drinking water, but there is no electricity and no showers.

We are leaving in the morning on Tuesday, August 22 and returning by the end of the school day on Thursday, August 24 (in time for students who ride the bus). It is a 90-minute drive and we will be traveling in 11-passenger vans. Students will be cooking our meals, serving each other, and cleaning up afterwards.

Activities will include driving the Peak to Peak Highway, hiking nearby trails from Bear Lake, exploring the Glacier Basin area, and possibly horseback riding at nearby Estes Park.

DMHS Trip Policy: Taking extended day trips is a core part of our Montessori adolescent program. It is during these trips that our students learn problem solving, adaptability, key social skills and independence. However, in order to insure the safety of all our students during an overnight trip, there are certain ground rules that must be followed in order participate or remain on a trip. Students while on trip are still held to the same behavior standards as outlined in the DMHS Family and Student Handbook. If a student's behavior rises to the level that it is no longer emotionally or physically safe for that student to be on trip, then the student will be removed from the trip and sent home.
